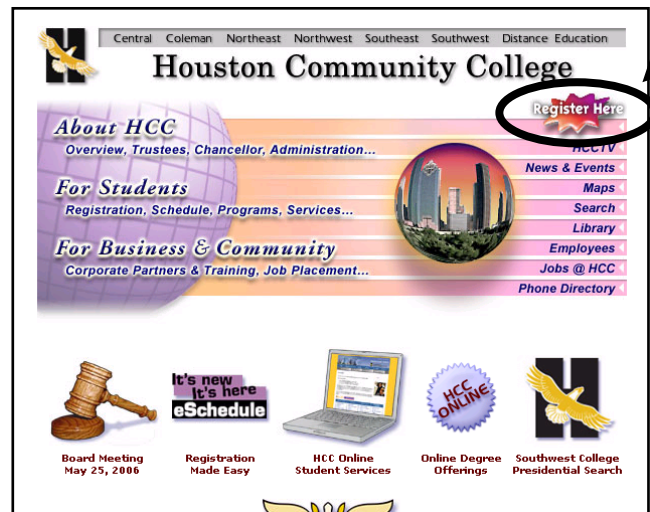

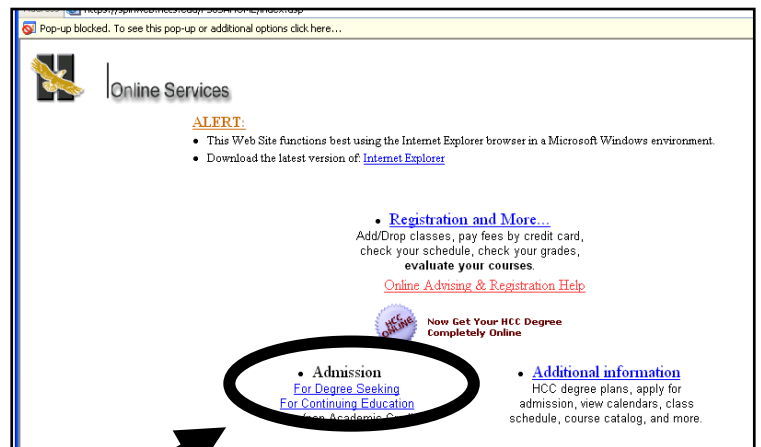

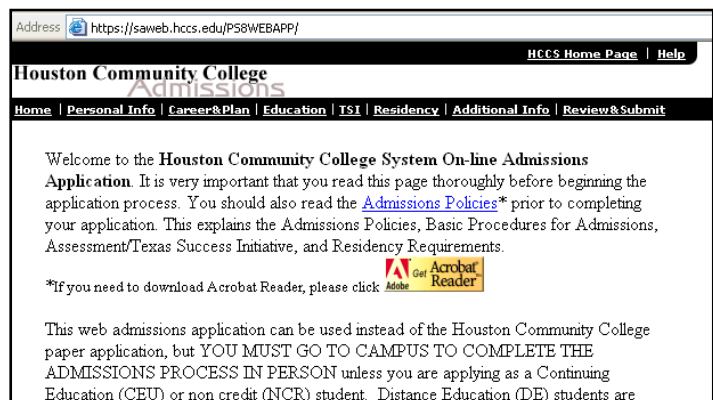
1. Go to <http://www.hccs.edu>.

5. Read and scroll down this page. Select “Next”.




6. Read and scroll down this page. Select “Start”.
