EXPECTATIONS AND POLICIES

for Pre-Advanced Placement and Advanced Placement Students

The Pre-Advanced Placement and Advanced Placement classes have expectations within their accelerated educational environment that each student must maintain. These expectations are

- To maintain an overall average of 75 or higher in each Pre-AP/AP class during each grading period;
- To complete assignments: classwork, homework, special projects;
- To bring necessary materials to class;
- To refrain from disruptive behavior;
- To maintain a high degree of organization;
- To participate and remain on-task in class;
- To maintain regular attendance;
- To refrain from excessive tardiness;
- To maintain other individual expectations and
- To adhere to the student code of conduct.

When students do not meet these program expectations, they are placed on an academic growth plan for a minimum of one grading period. The Growth Plan is intended to help students meet program expectations by identifying individual student problems and by providing a course of action which will enable them to meet academic standards. The Growth Plan is reviewed each grading period that it remains in place, and it is the documentation used to determine if the student should continue in the advanced level course. This agreement is in the best interest of the student. We agree to adhere to the program expectations and policies as outlined in this agreement. We also understand that the Pre-AP/AP courses are extremely rigorous and demanding. *We understand that the student must remain in the Pre-AP/AP course until the first report card is issued. After that, we understand that we have five (5) school days to request a change to a Preparatory class. If we choose to move from a Pre-AP/AP class to a lower level section the grade earned will remain on record, but would not be based on a five point GPA scale. We also understand that if we do not request a move to a lower level class within five (5) school days after the first report card is issued, the student will be required to remain in the Pre-AP/AP class for the rest of the semester.*

This document must be signed by all the student and parent/guardian and returned to any Pre-AP or AP teacher or to Mrs. Matlock in A205. **Only one document is required, no matter the number of PAP/AP courses the student is currently enrolled.** For additional information about AP and Pre-AP at Westside, please visit www.westsidewolves.org.
